Adcorp Computers & Adcorp Communications. The programming side of the business was split off in 2010 and was incorporated separately as Bella Isora Pty Ltd. It initially developed OpenOffice.net a small business software suite, but now also trades under a number of other trading entities. It has evolved in to a research and development company, developing iTrekSafe a hiking mobile app, IT Equip finances IT procurements, and the latest project, is PowerMe Plus, which involves research and development of a range of high-tech Fitness machines.

Paul comes from a family of small business owners with his parents owning a variety of small businesses in both Sydney and Tamworth. Paul's passion for business never stops. He is always working on something new.
